
School Health Profile 2018/19 Thurmaston Cluster

Key Statistics

The health of people in Charnwood is varied compared with the England average. About 12% (3,400) of children live in low income families.

- Deprivation is lower than average in Charnwood and life expectancy * for both men and women is better than the England average.
- The cluster has 13 primary and 2 secondary schools. 4590 pupils attend these schools and 51.1% are male.



School Health Profile



SEN Primary Need reflects the predominant need of each pupil. This is therefore a good indicator of the SEN provision requirements in your area.



Child Health Summary for Thurmaston

The chart below shows how the health of children in this area compares with the rest of England. This area's result for each indicator is shown as a circle. The average for England is shown by the black line, which is always at the centre of the chart. The range of results for all local areas in England is shown as a grey bar.
